Each project was assessed, by us, against the original challenge requirements; the criteria that MUST be met and those from which a selection was necessary.

Where projects fully met criteria, 1 point was awarded.

Where projects partially met criteria, half a point was awarded.

The maximum points possible were 28.

All projects met the minimum challenge requirements of involving older and young people doing things together; improving young people's skills and confidence; promoting harmony between people and teamwork between age groups.

Selection category included -

- Improving the environment
- Increasing a feeling of community safety
- To be long lasting
- Involve making, recycling or upcycling
- Potentially creating jobs
- Contributing to the local economy
- Bringing together people of all ages or from different backgrounds

Focus

- Young Entrepreneurs
- Intergenerational Micro-Enterprises
- Community Action Groups

Projects were scored again at their mid-challenge review and once more at their final review at the end of the 6 month challenge period.

The difference in scores in each category was added up to give the total 'added value' figure.

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Practicalities

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Focus

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Projects were scored again at their mid-challenge review and once more at their final review at the end of the 6 month challenge period. This total is their final, total score across all categories.

More experienced groups tended to start with a higher score because our expectations of them were greater, so they will have had an advantage when looking at these raw scores. Less experienced individuals, especially young people led projects will show a lower score because we were unsure how they might 'shape up'. So, this sheet needs to be looked at alongside the Progress Added Value sheet to get a more accurate view of our assessment of their distance travelled
